## Your Planting Planner

YOU CAN PERSONALIZE THIS SIMPLE SPRING PLANTING CALENDAR SO YOU KNOW EXACTLY WHEN TO PLANT YOUR GARDEN CROPS.

First, ask your county extension office (find yours at [csrees.usda.gov/Extension](http://csrees.usda.gov/Extension)) for the average date of the last frost in your area. Fill in the date: \_\_\_\_\_. In the right-hand column of this table, write in the planting date for each crop, based on the specified number of weeks before or after the last frost date.

<b>Eggplant</b>	Transplant	3 weeks after	
<b>Kale</b>	Transplant	4 weeks before	
<b>Kohlrabi</b>	Transplant	4 weeks before	
<b>Lettuce</b>	Seed	2 weeks before	
<b>Melons</b>	Transplant	2 weeks after	
<b>Mustard</b>	Seed	4 weeks before	
<b>Okra</b>	Transplant	2 weeks after	
<b>Onions</b>	Transplant	4 weeks before	
<b>Parsley</b>	Transplant	3 weeks before	
<b>Peas</b>	Seed	6 weeks before	
<b>Peppers</b>	Transplant	2 weeks after	
<b>Pumpkins</b>	Transplant	2 weeks after	
<b>Radishes</b>	Seed	4 weeks before	
<b>Spinach</b>	Seed	4 weeks before	
<b>Squash</b>	Transplant	2 weeks after	
<b>Strawberries</b>	Transplant	4 weeks before	
<b>Tomatoes</b>	Transplant	2 weeks after
